### 2022 Report of Pastors Jennifer and Seth Moland-Kovash

Pastors Jennifer and Seth Moland-Kovash

Let the floods clap their hands; let the hills sing together for joy. – Psalm 98:8

Our Stewardship team this year chose as their theme "Together for Joy." Do you remember the signs and the bulletin boards proclaiming that theme? We spoke these words about the floods clapping their hands and the hills singing from Psalm 98 in worship each Sunday in October, as we remembered to be joyful and remembered all for which we CAN be joyful. Whether we worship online or in person, whether we come to a Bible Study or an event or pray for one another at home, we are TOGETHER for joy and it is a joy to be together.

Let's remember together all the reasons for joy that God has put into our lives.

During 2022 we worshiped in person – sometimes modifying practices here and there as COVID spikes happened – but we worshiped together. We have been able to share and enhance our online worship options to provide opportunities for all to be together for joy. Through that ministry, our congregation has a truly global reach "for all to know Christ."

Our Sunday School and Confirmation students meet each Sunday morning. They are a large and joy-filled group. Come and join us in the sanctuary any Sunday at 9:45 to hear us sing "Go Tell It On the Mountain!" If you're interested in joining the teaching team, contact Pastor Seth or Emily Snyder. Our High School students meet twice monthly for service and fellowship and learning. Adult groups meet in various ways to continue to learn and grow together "for all to know Christ."

In last year's annual report, we wrote that our food pantry ministries serve 150 families per week. Between our "Pantry on Wheels" and our "Pantry on Rand" with its two distributions per week that number is now more like 400 per week. We go through growing pains and challenges, but we keep serving, joyfully. People keep getting groceries. Our partnerships with other organizations (Partners for Our Communities and Northwest Community Healthcare) and congregations (St. Thomas of Villanova and Holy Family Catholic parishes) keep growing. In fall 2022, All Saints reopened our doors as a PADS emergency shelter. In these and other ways, we continue to serve our community "for all to know Christ."

The financial support of all of these ministries continues with joy. Your pledging and giving makes it all possible. This is all coordinated by our financial teams of Stewardship Committee, Financial Support Committee, Treasurer (Bill Klaves) and Financial Secretaries (Karrie Benjamin and Bruce Ross). And the needs continue to be met "for all to know Christ."

We especially want to thank President Brian Carlson who has been an invaluable leadership partner along with the whole Congregation Council especially outgoing Council members Ed Garner, Diane Johnson, and Michelle Thompson.

In addition to all the wonderful members who make up All Saints and share in this ministry, this congregation is served by a wonderful staff. Each one of them continue to do amazing and creative things this year to get the job done in challenging and ever-changing circumstances.

Vicky Schnackel in the office and Sara Cole as Bookkeeper along with Cantor Doug Williams have served faithfully for all to know Christ. In addition, the staff of Little Saints PreSchool under Director Michelle Gutmann have helped those young people to learn and grow while being safe. We are grateful, and joyful, together.

That is the abiding feeling: joyful gratitude. We are grateful for the love of God shown in Jesus Christ. We are grateful for the opportunity to share in this ministry with such faithful and dedicated people (that's you!). As St. Paul wrote to the Romans: *I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed throughout the world.* Thanks be to God!

### **Worship Committee 2022**

This year we continued back to normal worship with 2 services 8:30 and 11 am. Summer schedule was Saturday 5pm and Sunday 9am. Sunday worship average attendance was 135 average which included Facebook participants. This year we had 9 baptisms.

During Lent we had less than 20 people for foot washing, something not done for a couple years. For the Easter Vigil we did have champagne, but the snacks were individual packaged instead of appetizers.

We were able to do our first catered meal in the gathering space for All Saint Sunday. It was good to see so many families participate, and the freewill offering was the most we have collected. We bought for 60 and fed close to 80.

Each year we have created a Lenten devotional with writers from the congregation. This year we added an Advent devotional.

For Lent we had midweek Lenten services but none for Advent. No Thanksgiving Eve or Blue Christmas service or community Thanksgiving dinner but hopefully we will be able to include next year as well as Lenten midweek soup suppers.

We are continuing to use the butterfly baskets to collect the offering at the suggestion from congregational members.

### All Saints Music Program 2022

2022 began with great hope "that Covid ends and 'normal' can be achieved again, or at least some of the missing pieces of our music ministry can again become possible."

From January through May, Adult Bells and Adult Choir continued to provide music for services as they had in 2021, with distancing, perhaps smaller ensembles, occasional mask wearing, and a "somewhat normal" return to making music in worship.

Alleluia Choir began rehearsals again in August when 10-12 children, ages five to eleven, came on Wednesday afternoons to sing, play, and prepare. They raised their voices in song, learned some new hymns and anthems for worship, and sang throughout the fall and for Advent and Christmas services. There is always room for more singers in the choir – consider bringing your child(ren) to sing with the Alleluia Choir!

Hoping to present our annual Advent/Christmas Cantata this year, rehearsals began in October and continued through the fall. The All Saints Choir and Cantata singers gathered weekly to rehearse. Orchestra musicians were contacted and music was distributed. All was prepared! And then Covid hit with revenge. First a couple choir singers, then this Cantor was struck the week before Cantata Sunday. We were forced to cancel dress rehearsals and could not present a cantata in 2022. Aaugh! Hope remains for success in presenting a cantata in 2023.

Do you love to sing? Do you sing in harmony on hymns? The All Saints Choir leads us in song throughout the year, singing psalms, hymns, anthems, and cantatas, their voices leading and helping us lift our hearts and voices in worship. Come add your voice to the choir.

Are you ambidextrous? Successful at juggling multiple cooking utensils? The All Saints Bells ringing helps set the mood for worship, playing settings of hymns and original compositions on handbells and chimes. Substitute ringers and new ringers are always welcome.

The music program at All Saints provides opportunities for all to share their musical gifts in worship, from the beginning student to the experienced adult, including singers and instrumentalists of all ages and abilities. If you have been blessed with musical talent and are not currently offering it, please consider sharing your gifts with our congregation – people who truly appreciate the music that is shared at All Saints. ### **Learning Committee Report 2022**

The Learning Committee's role in the life of All Saints is to help every member grow spiritually by offering ministries and programs that help us to learn about the Bible, about the world, and about God's mission. Working closely with both Pastors, this ever-changing team of leaders coordinates and supports the church's educational. The pastors want to thank all the dedicated and creative people who help to make all these ministries go no matter the circumstances. We continue to learn and grow in lots of ways. The primary Christian education programs include:

- Cradle Roll Providing faith-building material for parents of infants and toddlers. Claudia Nicholas coordinates this ministry which helps us all to fulfill the obligation we take on at each baptism to "pray and support this person in the Christian faith and life."
- Sunday School With a dedicated team of leaders led by Emily Snyder, our Sunday School ministry takes the primary responsibility for Sunday morning education for PreK through grade 5. We emphasize Bible stories and singing as a way to learn and have fun.
- Vacation Bible School VBS has traditionally been a great outreach method for All Saints, and we had a wonderful event in 2022, returning after a 2 year hiatus.
- Confirmation Confirmation ministry is for students in grades 6 through grade 8. We are seeking to help these young people prepare to affirm their baptism. They will promise to live among God's faithful people and serve all people, following the example of Christ. We want them to discover God's particular gifts to them and God's particular calling for them as part of the wider church.
- Youth Group Our high school youth group includes social, religious and service efforts. Our All Saints Youth Group works under the leadership of Pastor Jenn and Beth Carlson.
- Adult Education Providing educational opportunities through groups led by the Pastors and church members. Activities include mid-week bible study groups, daily education devotional email messages, and special learning events. 2022 saw a return of most activities to in-person meetings.

### Cradle Roll 2022

Cradle Roll is a ministry to children, ages birth to three years old, who have been baptized at All Saints Lutheran Church.

Since June 2017, Frolic Enewsletter has been a resource for baptized children and their families. Parents of baptized children ages birth to 3 years of age, will receive the Frolic Enewsletter. Each month, articles about child development and faith formation support parents in helping their young children take their first steps of faith.

Greeting cards are mailed to each family to commemorate their child's baptismal day as well as the anniversary of their baptism.

When the child turns three years old, the Enewsletter ends, and they are invited to continue the fun and fellowship of our faith family by participating in Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, and Little Saints Christian Preschool.

### **Little Saints Preschool 2022**

Little Saints Christian Preschool is now in its eighteenth year as an Outreach Ministry of All Saints Lutheran Church. The vision of Little Saints Christian Preschool is to provide a safe and nurturing Christ-centered environment for children to grow spiritually, cognitively, socially, and physically, and to share God's word with the children and families in our community. The mission of Little Saints is not only to embrace the children from our congregation but also those families in our community who have no church home.

Little Saints continued to ease the protocols observed to keep our children and staff safe from COVID-19, based on CDC and State of Illinois Health Department guidelines. Enrollment has recovered. While expenses are still higher than usual due to remaining COVID protocols, operating income is once again positive and Little Saints is financially self-sufficient.

Enrollment for the 2022/23 is 39 students — with only the 2-year and 3-year classes at capacity. There are open spaces in the 4-year old class due to the cut in capacity during the 2020/21 school year whose 2's would have been today's 4's. However, interest among families with younger children is strong. Little Saints regularly receives inquiries.

Summer camp was very successful. Lunch bunch is also back with half of the kids participating. Both activities make a positive contribution to operating income.

2022 was also another successful year for fundraising. The annual flower sale returned with plants from Bartels, a Michigan grower. We also continued the spring fundraising with local Hawthorn Gardens. Thanks to Carol MacCabe's leadership with arranging Dine & Share fundraisers, church members and Little Saints' families enjoyed dining out at Rep's (Rolling Meadows), the Taco Shop (Palatine), and Tre Amici (Palatine).

We are thankful for continued support and guidance from Pastor Seth and our Board members, many of whom are teachers. The staff was also steadfast in their dedication to providing a safe and fun experience for our little saints as they get ready for kindergarten. We also appreciate the time Bill Klaves and Sara Cole spent on supporting the payroll processing.

Our dedicated Preschool board this year consists of: Chair – Monika Fiedler; Vice Chair – Dawn Wurtz; Treasurer – Beth Carlson; Pastor – Seth Moland-Kovash; Michelle Gutmann – Director; Members-At-Large – Peter Carlson, Wendy Gumz, Michelle Thompson, and Carol MacCabe.

Little Saints loving, experienced teaching staff remained stable: Michelle Gutmann – Director and 3's teacher; Dawn DeCarlo – 4's teacher; and Vikki Drucker – 2's teacher. Teacher's aides are Kameron Cichy, Margie Arendt, Tricia Gallagher, and Robin Cohen.

We would also like to thank the congregation and the Church Council for their continued support of the Preschool. It is our prayer that through this ministry, we will continue to lead families and their children to Little Saints, allowing All Saints to grow this ministry for all to know God.

# Sunday School Report 2022 Leader: Emily Snyder

### General

Sunday School comprises children ages 3 years through Grade 5.

### Curriculum

We continue to use Whirl Lectionary curriculum by Augsburg Fortress. The stories that the children learn in Sunday School are the same lessons we use in worship.

### **Delivery**

With creative brainstorming among the leadership group, we continue to find ways help parents and grandparents teach about God's love. Each Thursday, our email list (you can join by contacting the church office) receives an email with lots of resources. There are song and video files, the Bible Story of the day, coloring pages appropriate to the day, and lots more. Each Sunday morning we meet at 9:45 am for class. We meet in the sanctuary for some prayer, Bible story, and offerings. Then the kids are divided according to age level. We've typically had 25-30 kids in the Sunday School realm. We held Vacation Bible School in 2022 for about 40 children (and 25 volunteers) and look forward to a "Stellar" space-themed event in 2023.

Pastor Seth is fond of saying that the home was always intended to be the first and primary place of faith learning. Kids learn about God and their place in God's love far more at home than anywhere else. Our job in Sunday School is to supplement that learning and provide the resources. The kids know God's love, they know the joy of living together in God's kingdom. They are a joy!

### **Vacation Bible School 2022**

This summer, the children of our community went on an adventure in the desert as we celebrated God's greatness with Monumental VBS!

After a two-year hiatus due to Covid, we were able to welcome back about 60 preschool to 4<sup>th</sup> grade aged children and they spent a week rotating through several stations: Imagination Station, Games, Snacks, Bible stories and Kid Cinema.

We had over thirty volunteers help throughout the week, and we were so impressed with our Confirmation and High School youth groups who served as crew leaders for each age group. We are extremely grateful to all the volunteers (a combination of church and community members) who helped create this successful event.

We would also like to give a special shout out to the members of All Saints who donated food, supplies and decorations – thank you for your support in the return of VBS.

A special thanks to Pastors Seth and Jenn, the planning committee and the station leaders for their time and effort. The kids all had a great time, and it was wonderful to have this special event return to All Saints.

### **Confirmation Report 2022**

Our Confirmation program is part of our over-all Discipleship Training. We are training together to be disciples. Specifically, students in grades 6-8 are training to affirm their baptism. In October, 2022 Amelia Aguirre, Gabriella Bova, and AJ Lynch affirmed their baptisms. Our Confirmation group meets at the same time as the younger ones on Sunday mornings, many of them participated in the Living Nativity, and they meet for "Sunday Night Live" monthly with the pastors. In the fall of 2021, we attended a synodically sponsored "Ultimate Lock-In" and will participate in the synod's Confirmation Retreat in January 2023.

### **High School Youth Group Report 2022**

The high school youth group at All Saints continued to meet once a month (or so) during the spring of 2022, and we even gathered during the summer to play games and check in. In the fall of 2022, we continued to gather once a month for fellowship and conversation.

New in the fall of 2022 is a monthly Donuts & Discussion time on the first Sunday of the month. This gathering is held in collaboration with the confirmation students during the education hour on Sunday mornings.

We're grateful for Beth Carlson's presence with the group, and the energy she brings to the gatherings. Together we keep in touch with our high school aged members, to remind them that they're children of God, holy and beloved, and that we're praying for them. We look forward to continuing to build the group and our involvement at All Saints!

### **Adult Education 2022**

In our Adult Education ministries at All Saints, we attempt to provide as many opportunities as possible for people to grow in their faith and their connection to this community. You may not be aware how many opportunities there are:

- Two weekly Bible study groups meet. Wednesday mornings at 7 am a group meets with Pastor Seth currently at Red Apple Restaurant. They are currently working their way through the book of Revelation. Thursday mornings at 9:30 another group meets with Pastor Jenn both in-person in the church library and over Zoom.
- Book Club groups of members meet regularly.
- Beginning January 15, 2023 an Adult Study group will meet on Sunday mornings at 9:45 working through a study based on the book "Surprised by Hope" by N.T. Wright.
- Each weekday a simple devotional message is sent via email. They are written by your pastors (and sometimes members). You can subscribe by sending an email to devotions@allsaintspalatine.org

### **Chapter One Book Discussion Group 2022**

It's hard to believe that the Chapter One Book Club is now in its 25<sup>th</sup> year. WOW! A quarter of a century of books read and discussed. That's at least 225 books. And members still share the same enthusiasm that was part of the first group meeting.

As was the case the past two years, Zoom has been how we have stayed connected. Once again, Joan Fedota facilitated Zoom calls for the club. Thank you, Joan! We look forward to meeting together in the 2023 calendar year now that restrictions have been lifted and group members feel comfortable gathering in person. We will offer a hybrid approach, both in person and via Zoom, to allow members to participate in the way they feel most comfortable.

We had some great selections in 2022, which included: *The Greater Journey, Americans in Paris* by David McCullough, *Anxious People* by Fredrick Backman, *The Girl with Seven Names* by Hyeonseo Lee, *The Midnight Library* by Matt Haig, *Wrapped in Rain* by Charles Martin, *Small Great Things* by Jody Picoult, *The Dictionary of Lost Words* by Pip Williams, *Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil* by John Berendt.

Our reading calendar runs from September through May, with December off for Christmas. Our members delight in sharing their perspective of a particular book along with learning about a book's author of other interesting facts related to the book. ### Food Pantry 2022

This year the Food Pantry continued to operate at the Northwest Community Healthcare Community Resource Center in the Community Cares Suite which is shared with the POC Clothing Closet. The center is located at 1585 N Rand Road in Palatine. The partnership between All Saints and St Thomas of Villanova has continued to grow and strengthen. Holy Family Catholic Church has approached us and has started to also partner with us.

As a result of the current economy and the large number of families fleeing Ukraine and Venezuela, we have seen a 200% in the number of families served. In January we were serving 407 families per month and by year end we are serving over 1200 families per month. Due to the increase in families coming to us for assistance we decided to open the pantry an additional day. We are now open for distribution on Thursdays from 4:00pm-6:00pm and Saturdays from 9:00am-12:00pm. As the year progressed, and the number of families coming to the pantry increased significantly, we made numerous changes to streamline the food distribution process to handle the increased volume.

The Mobile Distribution Pantry has also seen growth in the number of families. With the leadership of Bruce Ross, we were able to add another apartment complex to receive services. We are now going to Ports O' Call (Palatine), Country Glen (Arlington Heights), Baldwin Green (Palatine), East Park (Rolling Meadows), and The Preserve at Woodfield (Rolling Meadows) once per month. As with the pantry, the mobile has also seen an increase in their numbers. At year end we are seeing 550 families using the services of the mobile pantry.

Between the pantry on Rand and the mobile pantry we are serving 1750 families per month.

All this growth has been met with challenges on the amount of space we have for both storage and distribution. In fact, we needed to store the inventory for the mobile pantry in the church basement. We approached NCH early in the year to see if we would be able to do some renovations. With their help and the help from the POC we were able to secure grants from Cook County and the Buehler Family Foundation. These grants enabled us to expand the pantry and move toward a more "open concept" approach allowing us to use the space more effectively. We also were able to have installed double wide doors so we would be able to bring in pallets of food which are delivered weekly from the Greater Chicago Food Depository. Most of this year's construction has been completed and we are just waiting on having new flooring installed. The grants also will cover a pallet jack, an industrial refrigerator, and grocery carts. We appreciate the support that NCH has given us during this project to improve all the Community Cares Suite.

During 2022 Michael DeMeyer has been busy at work in making the presence of our pantry known throughout the community by participating in area groups such as Faith In Action and the Palatine Area Chamber of Commerce. In December we were recognized by the Palatine Area Chamber of Commerce as the Community Organization of the year at the 2022 Key to Success Holiday and Award Event. It is because of the dedication of many that the pantry continues to thrive even with the challenges of today.

### Caring for our homeless brothers and sisters— PADS and Summer Suppers 2022

Truly, I tell you, just as you did it to one of these who are members of my family, you did it to me. Matthew—25:40 (NRSV)

All Saints' commitment to caring for our brothers and sisters who have no home, and those who are food insecure, continues. Early in 2022 our focus was feeding PADS guests still housed in nearby hotels because of the COVID pandemic. Once a month we provided dinner for more than 100 guests, continuing a project begun in 2020 and made possible by generous financial support from the congregation.

In the Spring, as in years past, we resumed participation in the Summer Supper program. From May to September, once or twice a month we offered meals to our homeless and food-insecure neighbors at the church. Initially, this was done via a drive-through model of distribution. In July we were able to invite our neighbors back into our gathering space. We gave out 50-75 dinners on those Wednesdays in addition to supplying about 40 meals for PADS guests housed in the hotels.

At mid-year Journeys | The Road Home announced plans to shut down its program of housing PADS guests in hotels and reopen its faith-based network of overnight shelters. The All Saints PADS leadership team took a leap of faith and committed to opening our shelter doors again on October 1. Only 5 other churches did the same, leaving some days of the week uncovered. Prior to the shutdown there were 18 churches in the network.

We have been blessed that all our leadership team members returned to support PADS. Many of our volunteers have as well and we have also been able to welcome several new ones from the community and from faith communities that did not reopen.

The restart was bumpy, and the guest count has been low—from 4 to 11 guests per night—mainly because all families, as well as some guests, continue to be housed in the hotels. Our capacity was reduced to 16 to meet COVID protocols. We briefly did an every-other-Saturday schedule with Saint Alphonsus but are now back to a weekly schedule.

Sign up for food donations and volunteer shifts went digital in October. We previously used "Sign Up" for Summer Supper and hotel meals food donations. This has been working out well.

We are thankful to the members of All Saints who continued their leadership roles and adjusted their responsibilities to meet the needs of our homeless neighbors in this COVID-19 environment, from fulfilling the hotel meals, to Summer Supper, and now again the shelter activities: Karen Grossmann, Seiji Oyasu, Rick Gylling, Diane Gylling, Adrienne Bolbot, Karrie Benjamin, Jack Erlinger, and Nicole Scornavacco. In October, Emily Pizzimenti joined us as food coordinator. Monika Fiedler and Tom Germuska continue to serve as Co-Site Directors.

We are thankful for the financial generosity of All Saints members which has allowed us to continue to fulfill our mission. We also appreciate the many members that baked and cooked and provided food throughout the year. With your support, we shall continue our ministry to our homeless neighbors.

### **Personnel Committee 2022**

The Personnel Committee has the responsibility to prepare job descriptions and to establish personnel policies. Any hiring and discharging of non-called staff members are initially directed to this committee for review and further recommendations. This committee also provides overall counsel to any Personnel matters that arise during the year.

The committee met via zoom to evaluate and recommend compensation to staff and pastors. Recommendations were provided to Council for final approval and implementation.

The current Committee members are: Diane Hill, Richard Foltz, Karen Goodlow, Lydia Rohn, Jeff Witt, John Nicholas, Brian Carlson, and Pastor Seth.

### **Property Committee 2022**

Troy DeFranco and Mike Bolinger Co-Chairmen

As a commercial building, All Saints Lutheran Church is licensed for use by the State of Illinois and the Village of Palatine. The Property Committee is called to assure our facility remains in compliance with all regulatory requirements for the safe use of our building and grounds. This requires the scheduling and management of regular state and village inspections of:

- 1) Our elevator, both at the State and local levels as well as pressure testing the hydraulics on an annual basis.
- 2) The Ansul Fire Suppression System in our commercial grade kitchen annually.
- 3) An annual inspection of our fire extinguishers located in various areas in the building.
- 4) An annual building inspection by the village fire marshal, in addition to a State Fire Marshal checking all exit and emergency lights as well as our smoke detectors.
- 5) A separate inspection and testing of our wet and dry sprinkler systems throughout the building.
- 6) An inspection and testing of our four different "backflow" preventers on our water and sprinkler systems.
- 7) An annual inspection of the fire detection systems.

During 2022 we sought competitive contracts for services ranging from janitorial and lawn care to snow plowing. In addition, we have used repair and maintenance services for our heating and air conditioning equipment as well as maintained our various inspection requirements for our sprinkler systems, fire alarms and elevator equipment. Some specific major projects the Property Committee was involved with during the past year include:

- The installation of a new RTU that feeds the pasters offices, room 101 and the kitchen.
- The continued upkeep of the building including lights, smoke detectors, exit signs and emergency lights.
- We trimmed trees and bushes to keep our grounds safe and attractive.
- We performed workdays where those who attend ASLC helped with various maintenance projects on the building and grounds.
- We hired a new cleaning company to maintain the cleanliness of our building.

We are looking to the future with an eye on energy saving and safety projects such as:

- Replacing the fluorescent lights in the building with LED bulbs which offer the same amount of light at significantly reduced power consumption.
- Filling cracks in the parking lot before sealing and re-striping.

The property committee is made up of these regular volunteers: Mike Bolinger, Stan Shearer, Sam Krauss, Russ Peterson, Don Kanwischer, Matt Schmidt, Rich Finn, Chad Christenson, Brad Snyder, Troy DeFranco, and George Buerger. We offer our thanks to the many people who helped and supported our work this year. We will continue our efforts as stewards to the church and, with God's help, to provide a safe and welcoming environment for all those using our facilities.

### Ministry Endowment Fund (MEF) Committee 2022

The MEF was established (guided by ASLC bylaws) to provide grants in four categories: **Community, Synod, ELCA & ASLC**. Within the parameters of these four categories, Congregation members are encouraged to suggest organizations with "needs" for grant consideration. Our investments are managed by the ELCA Endowment Pooled Trust.

Established in 2004, the MEF is a perpetual endowment fund of All Saints, where investment income from the fund supports various outside ministries of All Saints. Funding began in 2006 with a generous gift of \$141,914. The Fund has grown over the years and, as of October 31, held assets totaling \$848,468. Since its inception, over \$221,000 in grants have been distributed.

All our meetings begin and end in prayer, seeking God's guidance as we endeavor to positively impact the lives of others.

Congregation members who contribute to the MEF Fund ensure the long-term viability of our work. We can truly say, "God's work. Our hands." because of your involvement.

As of November 30, 2022, the MEF committee approved \$37,877 this year for the following grants:

### The Community category received \$9,801:

\$3,000 to PAWS Chicago \$3,801 to Clearbrook \$3,000 to Habitat for Humanity – Spring of Life

### The **Synod** category received \$10,500:
